Religious Studies

The Religious Studies Department at Waddesdon Church of England School is successful and dynamic. We are a team dedicated to ensuring that each pupil achieves his/her potential and develops a profound understanding of religious, moral and spiritual concepts and issues.

All students in Key Stage 3 receive 1 lesson of RS a week. GCSE courses begin in Year 9, in line with the school's accelerated curriculum and all students take the full course GCSE examination, which has been very successful. We follow the AQA B course and students do the two papers: 'Religion and Life Issues' and 'Philosophical Investigations'. At A Level, students study Philosophy and Ethics. This is a well-established course with consistently high results.

The Scheme of Work aims to deepen the students' understanding of the Christian faith. At the same time an open-minded approach is encouraged through the exploration of a variety of religious traditions including Islam, Buddhism and Hinduism. Learners are encouraged to express both their own ideas and relate the ideas of others to themselves through evaluation. Consideration of moral codes is another major theme of the entire Scheme of Work.

The Department is well resourced with a wide variety of up-to-date textbooks for all levels. Classrooms have projectors, television, DVD player and a varied collection of DVDs. Religious Studies is taught in three classrooms.

We are a dynamic department, constantly evaluating our practice and reflecting on strategies for further improving the learning experiences and chances of the students. The teaching was judged 'Outstanding' by a recent SIAMS inspection (see website for details) and the department was described thus:
