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

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Sponsor-a-Seat

Due to open in February 2025, the <u>Jacob Rothschild Sixth Form Building</u> will provide focused study areas, a performing arts and lecture space, an innovation and enterprise suite and a reflection room. It has been designed to meet our young people's needs, enabling them to flourish, as they move from school to further study, employment and adulthood.

In a final push to get the funding we need to ensure the interior is as good as the exterior, we are inviting you to be part of our Sponsor-a-Seat initiative in the performing arts space/lecture theatre.



There are 105 grey/silver seats, 74 Waddesdon green seats and 31 gold seats.

If you would like to sponsor a "seat of learning" in the new space, simply go to the <u>School Shop</u> (no account necessary) or select an amount on <u>ParentPay</u> if you have an account linked to Waddesdon School.

We are suggesting: silver seat: £50; green seat: £75; gold seat: £100+

If you have already been a major donor for this once-in-a-generation project, we will allocate a seat to you in recognition of your support for the school. You can also commit to a monthy donation, which will also qualify you for a seat by clicking on the donation links on our <u>Sixth Form Building webpage</u>.

If everyone were able to commit £50 to the build, giving as little as £5 a month, we would be able to raise £50,000, an amount which would make all the difference.

Congratulations to students who had 100%, or improving attendance, last term. In our end of term assembly, while acknowledging that people face different challenges, we celebrated their achievements.

Attendance in December across the year groups was affected by seasonal illness, but held up well against previous years. Particular congratulations to Years 7, 8, 9 and 12.

Year 7: 95%; Year 8: 95%; Year 9: 94%; Year 10: 93% Year 11: 92%; Year 12: 94%; Year 13: 92%

Daily attendance, above anything else, makes the most difference to a young person's chances of educational success and their ability to cope with the challenges of life.

Post 16 Sixth Form Applications for September 2025

Thank you to all Year 11 families who attended the Sixth Form Open Evening and completed the initial eform on the school website about subject interest. Inspiring Futures Supporting our Sixth Form for Life beyond Waddesdon

Having submitted a fantastic set of university applications, we are currently supporting students in **Year 13** with apprenticeship, employment and gap year opportunities and applications. Students will all be seen for one-to-one support, with local employers coming into school to meet with students to promote their apprenticeships or internships. Interview support is also available at school for university, apprenticeship, employment and gap year opportunities.

Building on their visit to the University and Apprenticeships Fair at Northampton University last term, this half term **Year 12** will hear presentations from a university, degree apprenticeship provider and gap year company to help further inform their career options and applications. We'll introduce students to the Personal Statement, as well as supporting students with CV writing and LinkedIn Profiles.

You might hear through the media that the Personal Statement format is changing for 2026 and is now split into three sections where students answer these questions:

- 1. Why do you want to take this course/subject/apprenticeship?
- 2. How have your qualifications and studies helped you to prepare for this course/subject /apprenticeship?
- 3. What else have you done to prepare outside of education, and why are these experiences useful?

All students and families are warmly invited to our **school careers fair on Thursday 27th February**. Students all have personal Unifrog accounts which they can show you at home, which is a brilliant careers tool for all post-18 options.

We've prepared a <u>resource</u> for parents and carers so that you have access to the information you need and can support your son/daughter at home. We update it each year for our Year 12 *Life after Waddesdon* Evening in June.



Supporting your child with revision and exam preparation at home

At Waddesdon, we use the following steps with students to underpin a successful revision programme: plan, understand, condense, memorise/review and practise.

Supporting your Child's Health – Monthly Spotlight

'Ear 'ear for the New Year: helpful advice about ears:

People can live with a range of hearing difficulties, but here is some general advice from the Medical Team:

Hygiene – wash outer ear gently and regularly. Your outer and inner ear mechanism is wonderful and very fragile.

Ear wax – is important. It traps dirt, dust and odd particles. **Don't poke** - anything smaller than your elbow into your ear. Cotton buds are a big NO – causing more harm than good by pushing hardened wax further into the ear and can leave traces of cotton bud behind.

Look after your ears by: turning down the volume – ear pods, headphones and speakers.

Wear ear protection – if in noisy environments and with swimming. **Don't forget sunscreen** – when the sun does shine!


Hearing tests - temporary or permanent hearing loss can be due to a number of reasons: a blockage (hardened wax), infection, injury or occasionally a medical condition. If you are worried about any issues with your or your family's hearing, it's easy to access a hearing test. There are free online tests for those aged 18+ (eg the RNID) which indicate if you should seek a more thorough NHS test. For those aged under 18, please refer to your GP to arrange a formal audiology test.

Year 12 Work Experience: Thursday 3rd July – Friday 4th July 2025

To complement our careers programme, after Year 12 Predicted Grade Exam week in the summer term, all Year 12 students will spend two days on work experience placements or carrying out career-related activities. Work experience brings significant benefits for young adults; students will be able to experience the realities of day-to-day working life, ideally in an area of work in which they have some real interest and linked to their post-18 applications. It will enhance the post-18 options and careers-related work we have been completing with Year 12 this year, and it will be of great benefit to students as they write the first draft of their personal statements just prior to the summer holidays. Teachers will also be able to recognise work experience in their academic references.

Aims of our Work Experience Programme: To introduce students to the world of work (beyond parttime employment), its demands and disciplines and to develop students' employability skills. It also brings the curriculum to life by demonstrating how subjects can be applied and valued in the workplace.

Wednesday Late Bus

We encourage our students to take advantage of our late bus so that they can take part in extra-curricular activities (see <u>website</u>) and also if they need to catch up on, or complete work.

Route 1: Westcott, Ashendon, Upper Winchendon, Quainton (The Green), Pitchcott, Oving (Bowling Alley), North Marston (Pilgrim PH), Whitchurch (on request), Hardwick (on request)

Route 2: Kingswood, Grendon Underwood (all stops if required), Springhill (prison), Edgcott, Calvert (Green), Charndon (on request), Marsh Gibbon The Plough (on request), Ludgershall Village Hall (on request)

The buses will return to their depots in Aylesbury and so the bus company (Motts) have also indicated that they would be happy to drop students to a central point in Aylesbury, if required.

Both buses will leave school at 4.35pm, with the longest journey time taking approximately 45 minutes.

Travel Disruption: advance notice for two separate events

Between Monday 9:00am 20 January – Friday 12:00am 31 January 2025 general verge works will be undertaken along the A41 Bicester Road.

The works will include the installation of new drainage, with temporary sheet piling being installed to support the edge of the carriageway during the period of the works. These sheets will be removed when the works have been completed.

There will be a 24-hour lane closure, controlled by traffic lights during the duration of these works:

There will also possibly be a closure on **Waddesdon Hill from 31st January to 10th February** to complete the tie-in with the new roundabout and the bridge.

In both cases, we will adjust our days accordingly and record lateness sympathetically. We are also liaising with the bus and taxi services and will update you if there are any changes to the normal service.

Online How to Deal with Stress, Anxiety and Low Mood Course for Young People

Wednesday 26th February to Wednesday 26th March (5 weekly sessions), 6pm – 7pm on MSTeams

For young people aged 11-19 (25 with SEND)

This course aims to help young people name, express and normalise emotions, explore techniques for managing them and explore the relationship between thoughts, feelings and actions.

Who is it suitable for? Young people who struggle to manage their emotions (including anger), young people with low mood or mild anxiety, young people who are experiencing stressful situations. It is important that referrers and parents/carers know that we are not trained medical professionals or counsellors.



What to do if you're not happy about something

If you're not happy about something, please let us know and we will work with you to resolve the issue.

Our <u>Complaints Policy</u> outlines the steps you can take, but the simple message is to **get in touch with us.** If you send your concern to <u>office@waddesdonschool.com</u>, it will be directed to the right person.

You should expect to hear back in 48 hours, so if you have no reply by then, please ring the school office to check the progress on your complaint.

Even in moments of high emotion, we ask that you consider how best to convey your complaint. If the issue cannot be resolved by email or a phone conversation, then it is usually best to arrange a face-to-face meeting as lengthy email exchanges tend to become counter-productive.
